PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS

Alice Keck Park Memorial Garden 7E

Santa Barbara Street between Micheltorena and Arrellaga Streets OPEN SUNRISE - 1/2 HOUR AFTER SUNSET · STREET PARKING · 4.5 ACRES

This popular park features a large botanical collection (75 different tree and plant species), koi pond, sensory garden, interpretive Braille signs, low water use demonstration garden, gazebo, and picnic areas.

Alameda Park 7E

1400 Santa Barbara Street OPEN SUNRISE - 1/2 HOUR AFTER SUNSET · STREET PARKING · 9 ACRES

Covering two blocks and commonly known as Alameda Park, Alameda Plaza is one of the oldest City parks. The park features rare trees and a gazebo; it is home to Kids' World, an 8,000-square-foot wooden playground for two- to twelve-year-olds, with a castle, swings, and slides. Alameda Park's many reservable picnic sites are very

popular for children's parties. **Ambassador Park** 8G

100 West Cabrillo Boulevard OPEN SUNRISE - ½ HOUR AFTER SUNSET · STREET PARKING · < 1 ACRE

Located across from West Beach, this small park has a scenic view of the harbor, wharf, and islands. Once part of the Chumash village of Syuxtun, the park contains Burton Mound, a California Historic Landmark named after former owner Don Luís Burton. Beginning in 1902, the site provided a promenade from the beach to the Potter (later, Ambassador) Hotel; the land became a City park in 1924 after the hotel burned down in 1921.

Andrée Clark Bird Refuge 11F

1400 East Cabrillo Boulevard across from East Beach

OPEN SUNRISE – ½ HOUR AFTER SUNSET · ON-SITE PARKING · 42 ACRES This site's 29-acre lake provides a safe haven for migratory and local birds. A multi-mail (1) birds. A multi-modal (walking, running, and biking) path, interpretive self-guided tours, and walking trails make this a popular spot. Outdoor fitness equipment at the adjacent "Stretch Station" allows stretching before or after

Arroyo Burro Open Space 3G

OPEN SUNRISE TO ½ HOUR AFTER SUNSET · STREET PARKING · 22 ACRES

This open-space park in Las Positas Valley along Arroyo Burro was acquired in 2016. A creek restoration project was completed in 2018, which included improving existing walking trails and providing creek-

Barger Canyon Preserve 2B 3742 Foothill Road

GUIDED ACCESS ONLY; NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC • 14.9 ACRES

This preserve along upper Arroyo Burro was purchased by the City in 2013, and a large creek restoration project was completed on site in 2016. Access is limited to guided tours; please contact the Creeks Division at (805) 897-2658 for more information.

Chase Palm Park 9G

Bohnett Park 6F

OPEN SUNRISE – 1/2 HOUR AFTER SUNSET \cdot ON-SITE AND STREET PARKING \cdot 25 ACRES Made up of two areas on either side of Cabrillo Boulevard.

Ocean Side A narrow park adjacent to East Beach with an open grassy area and bike path/walkway from Stearns Wharf to East Beach, and home of the Sunday Arts and Crafts show

Mountain Side This 10-acre area of the park features fountains, a lagoon, and the shipwreck playground with areas for two- to twelve-year-olds. The stage is home to Concerts in the Park, a City-run free summer concert series. Indoor and outdoor areas are popular rental sites for parties and weddings.

Chase Palm Park Center 9G

Entry at Medcliff Road, Mesa School Lane, Barton Drive OPEN SUNRISE TO ½ HOUR AFTER SUNSET · STREET PARKING · 70 ACRES

Donated to the City in 1997, this large open-space area sits above Arroyo Burro Beach and contains walking trails and scenic ocean views. The park is a popular destination for dog owners, as off-leash use is permitted.

playground for two- to twelve-year-olds.

OPEN SUNRISE – ½ HOUR AFTER SUNSET \cdot ON-SITE PARKING \cdot 13 ACRES The beachfront at East Beach offers picnic facilities, a playground for

five- to twelve-year-olds, more than a dozen volleyball courts, and a full-service

restaurant. The Cabrillo Pavilion offers showers, lockers, a fitness room, and beach wheelchair and volleyball rentals.
